Celebrate a bit of the Old West in the heart of Wyoming's cowboy country . . . In Sheridan where the Old West meets the New West, history and recreation opportunities abound and there's not a better time to enjoy them than the fall!



This historic community showcases the spectacular Big Horn Mountain's snowcapped peaks, while calling to the adventuresome spirit with a myriad of recreational activities . . .

Rock Climbing opportunities are stellar in this area with premier ops at Steamboat Rock on top of the Big Horn Mountains and Tongue River Canyon, both a short drive from Sheridan. Join other outdoor aficionados to challenge yourself in new locations in the area.

And beginning in spring all the way into late fall, golfers find the area a paradise of opportunity for all levels of expertise. Dubbed Wyoming's Golf Capitol, Sheridan offers four championship courses with 81 holes within a 35-mile radius, including a GolfWeek's top 100 rated championship course and a course rated in the top 5 in Wyoming by Golf Digest.



In addition, hang gliding brings the mountains to life! Daredevils enjoy jumping into thin air off the face of the magnificent Big Horns, when the weather and air drafts are just right. Spectators watch and photograph as gliders soar above and beyond the Mountains at Sand Turn, west of Sheridan.

Also embrace the Old West to New West by exploring multiple museums and nearby historic sites which celebrate Native Americans and the opening of the West to pioneers and settlers. While in Sheridan, take time to tour and shop the historic Main Street District with 30+ buildings on the National Register of Historic Places. And thus adding yet another dimension to your Wyoming experience.

Prior to the late 1870s, the area now known as Sheridan County was considered a sacred hunting ground by Crow, Cheyenne and Sioux Indians - a more perfect hunting ground they could not have found. The Big Horns provided ample quantities of bear and elk, while dozens of glacier-fed streams were filled with trout and the short-grass range lands supported massive herds of buffalo, along with plenty of deer, antelope and game birds.



Today our long and rich tradition still boasts an abundance and diverse wildlife, drawing hunters and photographers alike. These prized hunting grounds are integral to maintaining the myriad of species for which we are known: mule and white-tailed deer, elk and moose, pheasants, gray partridge, sharp-tailed grouse and sage and Blue grouse, AND black bear.

Visitors embrace Sheridan as an authentic western destination with these just a sampling of the varied activities, just waiting for you!
