The Big Horn Mountains had 18-24" of new powder over the weekend. Off Trail Snow Base 32" to 45" and up to 60% chance of snow this week! Come ride this boondocker heaven in vast open meadows and on 300 miles of groomed and 50 miles of ungroomed trails just awaiting you . . .
