



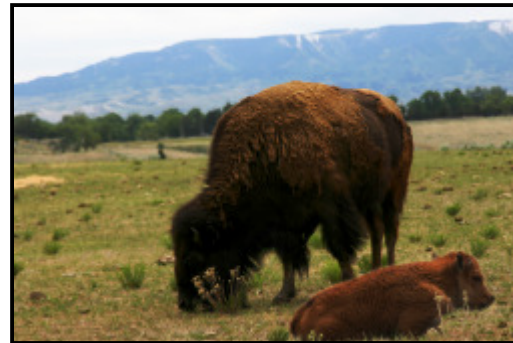
# WILDLIFE TOUR I

## (1) THE WYOMING GAME AND FISH DEPARTMENT VISITOR CENTER

Located just off I-90 and the 5th Street interchange is the Game and Fish Visitor's Center. The center's goal is to increase the public's awareness and interest in wildlife and conservation. Several exhibits are handon and the remaining display natural habitat for wildlife native to northeastern Wyoming The Visitor's Center is open Monday through Friday 8 AM to 5 PM. The Visitor's Center can be reached by calling (307) 672-7418.

## (2) KENDRICK PARK

Adjacent to the park is a wildlife area which is home to a small herd of buffalo and elk Spring is a great time to view the newborn buffalo and elk. There are several areas along the fenced enclosure for taking photographs of these amazing creatures. The animals are for viewing only. Please do not feed them.



## (3) WYOMING BIRD FARM

Operated by the Wyoming Game & Fish Department, the Bird Farm rears ring-necked pheasants. This facility raises nearly 16,000 birds annually for release in habitats throughout the state. An information center houses displays, photos and information about the birds. The Bird Farm is open May through September to view the birds in fenced enclosures. Hatchlings can be seen in early May. #### (4) STORY FISH HATCHERY

Open year-round, the Story Fish Hatchery operated by the Wyoming Game & Fish Department is a perfect spot for a family outing or picnic. The visitor's center is open April 15 through September 15 with many educational displays. Lake trout hatchlings occur in April and May. Spawning is in October. Bring a loaf of bread to feed the huge trout in the display pond. Picnic at the recreation area or fish Piney Creek just below the hatchery.
